A very polite guesser, choosing the next most likely word based on patterns in data, not actual understanding.


May sound confident, but it's not insight or expertise.

- 4. One sentence about your experience with Al






Effective Prompts

- 1. Begin with purpose. Why are you prompting?
- 2. Gather reference.
- 3. Prompt Al
- 4. Vet results. Are they accurate and viable?
- 5. Decide how to proceed. Do you need to re-prompt?

- Video and avatar creation


