Why This Research?

D2L & QM Partnership (Late 2023)

- Collaboration to explore new opportunities for quality assurance in online and blended learning

Expanding Learning Opportunities

- Identified best ways to share our work with the field
- Developed new learning experiences to support educators and institutions

Masterclass: Quality Learning by Quality Matters

- Focused on best practices for ensuring quality in online and blended education

Community Engagement & LMS Template Exploration

- Sought insights from the community on LMS template usage
- Aimed to refine and enhance quality-driven course design

Past Research Shows that Templates Improve the Student (and Faculty) Experience



LMS Templates can...

affect student engagement, self-efficacy, motivation, & learning outcomes.


affect satisfaction in online courses by positively impacting social presence, perceived usefulness, and engagement with course content.

facilitate monitoring student participation and use of course materials – and learning analytics can enhance engagement and academic performance.

be useful for creating and managing online courses and can affect faculty satisfaction.

What is an “LMS template”?

- Provides a **skeletal organizational outline** so faculty can concentrate on their pedagogical design
- **Does not impact design** creativity or academic freedom
- Provides **good navigation plus quick links**/easy access to institutional/organization resources and tools
- Can include both course & **module-level organization**
 - Placeholder for module intro & objectives
 - Placeholder for “read, watch, do” items





Most Institutions Use an LMS Template



How many years has your institution been using the LMS Template?



 - Required elements (institutional support, etc.)
 - Suggested elements
 - Examples
 - Structure




Supporting Online Learners & Instructors

- LMS templates provide a **consistent student experience** across courses or within a degree program.
- Well-designed LMS templates are **easy to use** and provide **embedded student support**.
- For students, this **reduces cognitive load**, increases support, and allows them more time to spend on course activities.
- For instructors, templates reduce student support questions, leaving **more time for engaging, guiding, and connecting** with online learners.








Creating Efficiencies

Faculty/designers can better spend their time on developing **engaging content and activities**.




Many LMS templates come with **pre-built structures** for modules, pages, and even assignments.



These pre-designed elements **save** course developers a substantial amount of **time and effort**.




Most LMS Templates at Institutional Level



LMS templates as a Program Resource

Imagine you are creating a new, fully-online program at your institution...


- Creating an LMS template for the program allows you to **customize and brand** something specific to the students who will enroll.
 - You can create a custom Banner or graphic for the template, and include a common navigational structure and layout.
 - You might also include relevant **professional resources** as part of the left-hand navigation, along with **institutional support resources**.





LMS Templates Within a Program

Creating an LMS template for an online program can also enable:

- Students to feel a greater sense of belonging (“**cohort feel**”) & to quickly learn how to navigate all courses in the program.
- Good departmental **conversations around program competencies** and curriculum mapping.



How do you develop an LMS template?



Begin with Collaboration and Needs

- Consider a committee of stakeholders, including faculty and students
- Determine what needs you want the LMS to meet; collect baseline data
- Discuss structure and functionality
- Provide flexible ways to use and integrate; provide training and resources
- Collect evidence for efficacy and improvement; Communicate ROI

Placeholders to Help Learners Get Started



GS 1: Course Overview & Introduction



A **“Start Here” Folder** to organize (usually sequenced) items for learners to review on day one.



A **Course Overview** that explains the purpose of the course and how its structured.



Vital course items, such as the **syllabus**, **schedule**, **learning objectives** & relevant **course policies**.



Placeholders for building community: **instructor & learner introductions** to create a welcoming environment.

Examples of Pre-Built Organizational Structures

- **The “Start Here” Folder:** welcome, orient, ↑ presence
- **The Home Page:** Announcements, Calendar, etc.
- **Module Layout, with aligned placeholder items**
 - Module introduction/overview
 - Module objectives & relevant Course Objectives
 - “Read/Watch/Do”: content, activities, & assessments
 - Module summary and next steps






